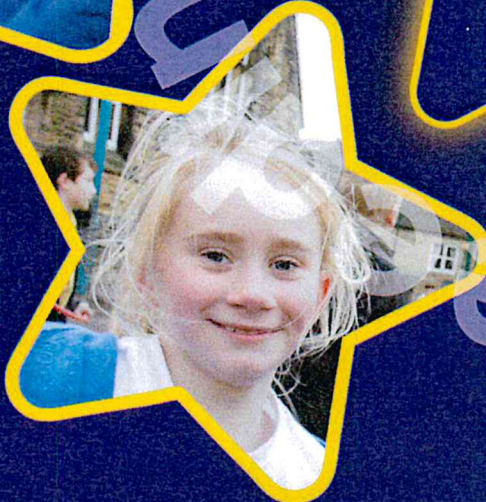

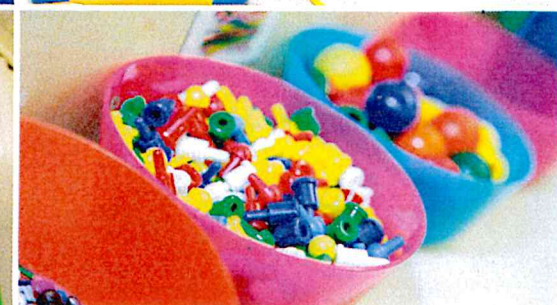

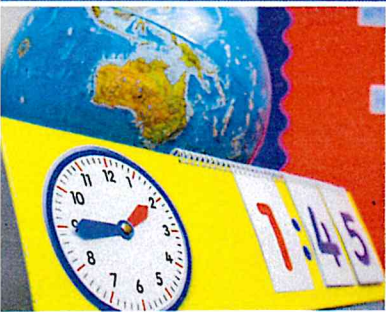

Our School

Harden Primary School was founded in 1877 and part of the school is still housed in the original Victorian Building. The school is at the centre of the village and is an important part of the community. A hall and new classrooms were added in the 1960s and recent extensions have enabled us to improve our provision and facilities further.

Harden Primary School is a one form entry school. It provides good quality education for children aged between 4 and 11 years old. The school converted to academy status in 2013, the first primary school in the area to do so.

The school has seven classrooms, one for each year group. Other areas provide space in which to teach classes and small groups, e.g. library, work rooms and technology area. Each class uses technology such as interactive whiteboards and laptops in support of the curriculum. The school offers a well-stocked library, after school activity clubs and lunchtime play support.

We are proud of the work our children produce and this is displayed around school.

Two playgrounds provide space for lunch and playtime, as well as outdoor provision for the children in Reception class.





Positive Behaviour

The school has a positive approach to behaviour and discipline. We have consistent expectations of appropriate behaviour throughout all age ranges. A calm but stimulating atmosphere is required to enable all children to do their best work and reach their potential.



Admission Procedures

Although Harden Primary School is an Academy, applications are submitted to Council of Bradford's Admission's team. Children are normally admitted full-time to the Reception class in the September of the school year in which they become 5. From time-to-time spaces do become available in other year groups however applications must still be submitted to the Admission team.

The Governors have established the following criteria as the basis for admission:

- Children with siblings already in the school
- Children living in the immediate area
- Children from a wider area

Further information can be sought from the Admission Team.

Application forms for places into Reception class are sent to parents via pre-schools and nurseries, usually in November. The application pack will give full details of how to apply and the deadlines.

The Admissions team are responsible for allocating the places, however, parents who are unsuccessful in gaining a place have the right to appeal to the Local Education Authority.

Transfer Arrangements

Reception Transition

Before Reception class children start in September there are a number of opportunities for parents to meet with the Headteacher, the class teacher and the nursery nurses. Your child will have the opportunity join us for events such as Teddy Bear's Picnic, Stay & Play and to sample school lunch.

Year 6 Transition

Transfer to secondary school is at the end of Year 6 (age 11) and is dependent on the admission policy of the receiving school. Children from Harden usually transfer to Parkside School, Bingley Grammar or Beckfoot School. Our pupils have also been successful in gaining places in Bradford Grammar, Skipton Girls, Ermysteds and North Halifax Grammar School.

In-Term Transfers

In other stages in your child's education it may be necessary to transfer to a different school. This will usually take place at the end of a term to minimise disruption. In cases where a house move means a change of school, both schools will discuss appropriate start and finish dates with the parents. Pupils records will be passed on to your child's new school.

Safety and Security

All parents need to feel reassured that their child is safe in school and we all need to share in that responsibility.

In order to keep your child safe, the school doors are locked at 8.50am and the playground gates are locked at 8.55am. Parents are asked to enter the school via the main entrance.





Celebration Assembly

Parents & relatives are welcome to join us at our weekly Celebration Assemblies. Friday morning is a special time at Harden Primary when the whole school comes together to celebrate our children's achievements. School certificates are awarded to children who are 'Believing, Achieving, Succeeding' and displaying good practices of our Ethos, Values & Aims. It is also a time when our children bring in their trophies, medals and certificates so we can join in celebrating their successes outside of school.

Special services to celebrate events such as Harvest, Christmas and Easter are held and everyone is welcome to attend.



Parental Involvement

Autumn Term

During the Autumn Term, all parents are invited to an evening curriculum meeting, at which the class teacher will present an overview of the curriculum for each year group and so that parents can find out what their children will be learning during the forthcoming year.

Parent consultation evenings are held in November and each parent is offered a time to speak to their child's class teacher about their progress and how parents can help at home. This is repeated again during the Spring Term.

Parents receive an Annual Report at the end of the summer term, which gives details of their child's progress and attainment, it also includes key points for further development.

Each Term

Parents are invited to a class parent event that takes place in their child's working environment. This may be a stay and play session, class assembly, themed activities or a workshop run by the children.
