



Dear Parents and Children,

Reception Curriculum Information- Spring 1 2019

Firstly we would like to thank you for your support during the last term, with our parent events and nativity- it was all very much appreciated.

This term we are beginning with a 'Winter and Cold Places' theme and have had an 'Ice Day' as a 'Hook' to capture the children's interest! Today we have enjoyed a whole host of activities such as; 'freeing the frozen Anna', building igloos with ice cubes, experimenting with ice and building ice (sugar) cube igloos! Following this we will look at the Arctic, the animals and people that live there and how the environment differs from ours here in Harden. We will continue to use a variety of key texts throughout the topic, starting with *Geronimo* by David Walliams and *The Emperors Egg*.

Personal, Social and Emotional Development: Over the next half term we will continue to encourage the children to play co-operatively, taking turns with each other, as well as encouraging independence. The children will take more responsibility for their own learning by completing independent activities in addition to the rainbow challenges.

How can you help at home?

Promote independence around the home and encourage them to ask for help when they need it. Encourage your child to take responsibility for some of their own things and tidying away after themselves when they have been playing.

Phonics: Children will continue to say sounds in words and blend them together and know which letters represent some sounds. They will now begin to read words and simple sentences, and begin to apply their phonics to writing their own words and captions. We will begin to send home short word lists from the phonic sessions that re-cap previously learned sounds, and will include alien/ nonsense words. We will continue to change the home reading books on a **weekly basis**, but the children will now be given a new designated day - this day will be stuck onto your child's home journal next week. Please ensure your child has their books in school every day.

How can you help at home?

Read as often as you can, 5-10mins every day if possible, to enable your child to have lots of practise. Ask your child to attempt spelling words using their phonic knowledge. Look out for the real/nonsense word lists and practice them at home.

Mathematics: We will be working with numbers up to 20, counting, writing numbers and being able to find 1 more / 1 less by heart. We will also be using numbers to practically add and subtract and applying this in the context of money. We will continuously count as a whole class and in groups, using varied multiples of 1's 2's 10's, forwards and backwards.

How can you help at home?

Spot numbers in the environment on road signs or house numbers, especially 2 digit numbers. Help your child recognize small coins 1p, 2p, 5p, 20p.

Physical Development: Children will continue to have opportunities to use a variety of equipment both indoors and outdoors. Fine motor physical development will focus on using a pencil to correctly form letters of a consistent size. During whole class gross physical development sessions the children will be learning a variety of skills to apply to different sports including hockey. Please send your child in their school PE kit on a Wednesday (with Mr Maiden) and Thursday (Sports Coach) this half term.

How can you help at home?

Practise writing short captions to develop letter formations. Practise forming letters in different 'textures' such as shaving foam or sand.





Parental Engagement: It was wonderful to see so many updates on **Tapestry** over the holidays. Remember that you can update anything that 'WOW's you, or a recent step in progress that you have seen in your child... we are specifically asking for any additional updates on use of ICT and family traditions that your child has taken part in over Christmas.
